


#### Active School Flag

As you may be aware, there has been a new book scheme launched by the Department of Education to commence in September 2023.

This scheme, which we are delighted to see, will remove both the time and financial burden from parents in relation to the purchase of books.

As outlined in the documentation produced by the Department, it is the school who will own the books and the pupils will have them on loan for the year. However, this grant will not be sufficient to cover the costs associated with schooling for the year.

Parents should see a significant drop in the back to school expenses as a result of this scheme, however there are still areas which are left unfunded.

Art supplies, photocopying, stationary, extra-curricular and pupil insurance are some of the costs which fall under this remit.

The school will do its very best to keep costs as low as possible for parents.

In particular we are looking for Irish Books and Maths Books that are in good condition and not written in. We would be very grateful for any books given to the school.
